- Difficulty with meeting the original timeline
- Holidays have caused delays and we want to make sure that everyone is plugged in
- New edits deadline of January 10th
 - o Between now and January 10, there will be editing on the annual report
- The new draft represents an effort to include all councilmembers' comments
 - Please let Janet, Karen, and chapter leads know what further comments councilmembers have
- Will allow individual council members to put their name on the report (no vote) and will not discuss revisions to the report after January 10th
- We have an opportunity to think carefully about navigating industry ties/conflicts on the council
 - o Can discuss this at the January meeting
- Hoping Karen's introduction statement can evolve into a guiding principle for the council
- Discussion:
 - There are challenges and opportunities that new members provide to the board, disagreement can help test what is effective and doable
 - Can help to make the report viewed better by both communities and industry stakeholders
 - Used to seeing people vote up or down and have a public record of where people are
 - Chairs checked with the attorney general's office and they were told that the council has discretion in terms of approving the reports (the chairs felt like they were putting a lot of pressure on councilmembers to get it done in the initial timeline)
 - o Included public comments int the appendix
 - o In 2025 we hope that we can start with the continued work of the council and not extend the conversation about the 2024 report
 - Only a quick conversation at the January meeting
 - Suggestion to provide a majority and minority view/letter
 - There is a difference between a bias and a conflict of interest, we all have biases and opinions about what we think
 - o Important to have different viewpoints and discussions included
 - In Chapter 6, there is a recommendation about having additional conversations focused on bias
 - o Do we lose some of our power by signing individually vs as a council?
 - In the past, we have disseminated the report in the same manner as if it had been voted on by the full council

- Mary Hill
 - o Represents Hobson Village, Pughsville, Chuckatuck
 - o Concern is that the environmental adverse impacts are included in the report
 - o She wants an action plan to give the community a lifeline
 - Her community is becoming pockets of poverty (ongoing encroachment and development), redefining them as not an "EJ community" because of the recent census
 - Afraid that they will be overlooked with new development and expensive homes coming into the community
 - EPA identified Hobson Village as disadvantaged in 2025, and nothing has changed, but development around them
 - o Wants an action plan and implementation in place to save their villages
- Laurena Taylor
 - Her community is having the same environmental injustice impacts such as flooding, lack of proper grading of the stormwater ditches and air quality impacts
- Discussion:
 - There are real limits on what the council can do
 - The council can make recommendations to the administration and to potential legislators as well, but we can not take action
 - o The council can leverage the organizations that we are connected with to provide some resources and raise awareness
 - Work of the council to amplify and provide a public record of these issues
 - o The council's role is advisory
